Notice of Collection of Personal Information

Under the California Consumer Privacy Act (“CCPA”), as a California resident (“you” or “your”), you have the right to know the following categories of personal information that MetaBank®, National Association, d/b/a Meta Payment Systems (“we” or “us”) collects about consumers. You also have the right to know the business or commercial purposes for which we collect this personal information.
